King Lear at The Guthrie & Backstage Tour

Shakespeare's epic tragedy on the Wurtele Thrust Stage is "King Lear". After years of ruling Britain in peace, a respected King Lear decides to relinquish his crown and divide his kingdom among his three daughters, but when their love and loyalty falters, so does Lear's sanity. "King Lear" is a gripping portrait of fathers, daughters and a once-mighty ruler thwarted by his own hubris and betrayed by a vanishing mind. 





Cedarholm Golf Course Clubhouse Replacement

In recent years the Parks & Recreation Commission & City Council have discussed the condition & needs of the Cedarholm Golf Course Clubhouse.

- June 2015: Council tasked the Parks & Recreation Commission to look into what improvements were needed; gain a better understanding of golf opportunities; identify options & cost estimates & meet with the Finance Commission to discuss financial considerations.
- November 2015: the Commission updated the Council on replacement options. With this information, the Council directed the Commission to engage the community in analyzing the replacement of the Clubhouse & considering funding options.
- March 2016: A Citizen Advisory Team began 6 months of meetings to learn about golf operations, explore community needs & formulate recommendations for the replacement of the Cedarholm Clubhouse.
- October 2016: Council accepted the Advisory Team report & authorized staff to seek a proposal to develop concept/schematic design for the Clubhouse & prepare budget estimates.
- December 2016: Proposal materials due with the intention of bringing the information to the Council in early January for final approval to move ahead with final design work. The next round of Clubhouse Replacement Community Engagement will begin with the contracting of a design firm.

Community Input & Planning

2017 sees Parks & Recreation working on projects in Southwest & Southeast Roseville. As is the case with all Parks & Recreation projects, these upcoming initiatives will involve community meetings that will gather input & share findings & designs. Community meeting will be announced on the City of Roseville website, through Nextdoor.com & by direct mailings to the surrounding neighborhoods.

- **Tamarack Park** is the final Renewal Program playground replacement project. Staff will work with neighbors & the community to design the play area as well as create a park entrance & pathway to the play area.
 - Following community input & design, a community playground build will be scheduled. This is a great opportunity to get your hands dirty & make a difference in your community.
- **1716 Marion Street** is one of Roseville's newest park areas. While this is a small parcel, it will take big community input to plan this neighborhood gathering place.
- **2132 Cleveland** is located in Southwest Roseville (southeast corner of County Rd B & Cleveland Avenue). This Renewal Program acquisition is positioned to anchor the west end of Roseville & provide added greenspace to the neighborhood.



Deer Management Program

At the end of 2016, the Roseville City Council authorized staff to implement a deer reeducation program using services provided by the United States Department of Agriculture. This action followed years of study documenting local deer population, evaluating management options & gathering input from community members.

In the first quarter of 2017, reduction efforts will take place in Central Park East, Ladyslipper Park, Owasso Hills Park & the Roseville Leaf Compost Site.

Registrations confirmed with registration receipt by mail or e-mail. If you do not receive a receipt call 651-792-7006. Assume programs will be held at time & location indicated & that you are enrolled unless you hear from us.

Roseville Resident Status

All Roseville residents, and anyone who works a minimum of 30 hours/week at a location in the City of Roseville receives an \$8 discount on individual program registrations. All adult team sports prepay an Adult Team Sports Nonresident Fee at registration. Refunds issued upon proof of residency or employment location. To qualify for nonresident fee refund, all team members must live or work at least 30 hours per week in the City of Roseville.

Minnesota Data Practices Act

In accordance with the Minnesota Data Privacy Act, the Parks & Recreation staff informs you that the personal information we request of you and/or your child is private. This private data is available to you and the Parks & Recreation staff who need the information to perform their duties, but not to the public.

Refunds

To cancel your registration, notify the Parks and Recreation office at least 3 business days before the start of the activity. All cancellations are subject to an administrative charge on individual registrations. No refunds issued for cancellations made within 3 business days unless there is a medical reason or you are dissatisfied with the program. In that case, a prorated refund will be credited to the customer's recreation account. For activities that have advance program expenses or advance set-up, refunds will only be given if the customer cancels by the specified deadline or if a replacement is found.
