POLICE SEEKING PUBLICS HELP IN LOCATING MISSING PERSON

The Roseville Police Department is seeking the public's help in locating Carl Clark, a 50-year old Roseville resident last seen leaving Hennepin County Medical Center in Minneapolis on Thursday, February 25, 2016 at 2:40 p.m.

Clark is considered a high functioning vulnerable adult who lives in a group home on the 2200 block of Lexington Avenue in Roseville.

Clark is described as a black male, 5'3" height and 150 pounds, last seen wearing a blue jacket, gray beanie and gray pants. Clark is also a double amputee with prosthetic legs. Clark has limited resources and no friends or family living in the metropolitan area.

If Clark should be seen or located, the public is asked to call their local law enforcement authorities. Police do not believe Clark is a threat to himself or the public.

UPDATE!

Roseville missing person Carl Clark has been located and returned home.

According to a police report, Clark called his group home at approximately 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, February 27. Clark's guardian traveled to the Hennepin County Medical Center in Minneapolis, located him and returned him to his Roseville care facility.

A Roseville sergeant interviewed Clark upon his return and found him in good health and not needing any medical attention.

When questioned about his whereabouts, Clark claimed he had spent the night "under a bridge." Clark didn't provide the sergeant with any additional details as to where he had been the previous 48- hours or

why he didn't attempt to make contact with his care takers shortly after realizing he had missed his Metro Mobility ride Thursday afternoon.

The Roseville Police Department considers the matter closed.
